







Internal Security Agency implements the project entitled "Strengthening CBRNE safety and security – Coordination and Standardization ". The project is financed by the Programme "Home Affairs" implemented under the Norwegian Financial Mechanism for 2014-2021. The Programme is at the disposal of the Ministry of the Interior and Administration.

The project aims to improve the security of the state and its citizens by preventing and combating CBRNE threats (the so-called chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear factors and explosives).

The project responds to the needs of different services and institutions to standardize procedures to take appropriate action both in the event of a threat and a crisis arising from the use of CBRNE factors.

The project will be implemented in the period from May 2021 to March 2024.
